

Eye Care Appointments

It is the responsibility of Dr. Adam Koenigsberg to make sure that all patients schedule their new and follow-up visits, and retain them. When checking out at the front desk after your appointment with the doctor, we understand that scheduling appointments can be a difficult task at times due to today's busy lifestyle. Dr. Koenigsberg would like to make certain that you understand the importance of scheduling a follow-up visit. Continued care is essential to the health of the eyes. Some follow-up care is recommended as far out as six months to one year from the last date of treatment. You or your dependent minor may have an eye condition which can worsen without proper care. Permanent damage can occur, resulting in visual loss or blindness, if certain follow-up care appointments are not made or kept.

We would like to advise you that if you cancel your follow-up appointment and do not reschedule, or do not show to your follow-up appointment, our office will send a Letter of Medical Concern to your household and to doctor's offices that you have listed in your patient encounter form. Reminder courtesy postcards are mailed when a patient needs to schedule a follow-up visit further than two months out. A Letter of Medical Concern will also be sent to patients who do not respond to the courtesy postcard that our office mails to remind you to call and schedule your next appointment.

In today's society it is very important for a Medical Doctor's office to document all attempts made to ensure proper healthcare. We would like you to understand and appreciate that the mailing of a Letter of Medical Concern is common practice in today's Medical Specialist's office.
